

**POST-16 TRANSPORT – LOW INCOME FAMILIES  
2017/2018 Academic Year**



To qualify for 'low income' Post-16 transport assistance students **MUST**:

- Be under the age of 19 years on 1 September 2017 and;
- have applied for a full time course (a minimum of 17 hours per week) and;
- live over 3 miles from their catchment 6<sup>th</sup> form or
- live over 3 miles from their nearest college offering the vocational area they are studying.

- An income related employment and support allowance
- Support under V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
