

Commons Act 2006 – Schedule 3 paragraph 2(b)
NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO AMEND THE REGISTER TO RECORD AN HISTORIC EVENT

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by **John Roper Williamson** (“the Applicants”) to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority, under Schedule 3 paragraph 2(b) of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014.

The application relates to common land register CL70 Burgh Marsh.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: The right to graze 10 stints (one stint being equal to one beast or 4 sheep or 2 sheep and 4 lambs) on Burgh Marsh comprising the whole of the land in this register unit (“the Right”) is currently registered as not attached (held in gross) at entry 2 of register unit CL70 in the name of Mr J.E.Williamson. The Applicant claims that by an Assent dated 24th February 1993 the Right was transferred to them. The Assent does not operate at law until registered by the Commons Registration Authority in the register. The Applicant seeks by this application to complete the transfer of ownership and register the Right in their own name.

If the application is granted, in whole or in part, the Commons Registration Authority will give effect to the determination by deleting current entry 2 (making reference to the new corresponding entry) and making a new entry in the register to show the Applicants as the owners of the Right.

Any person wishing to make representations:

- must quote the Application No. **CA14/18**
- must state the name and postal address of the person making them, and the nature of that person’s interest (if any) in any land affected by the application and may include an e-mail address;
- must be signed by the person making them;
- must state the grounds on which they are made; and


Any representations made will not be treated as confidential, to determine the application it will be necessary for the commons registration authority to disclose information received to others, which will include the Applicant and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998). Representations may also be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The period for making representations expires at 5pm on 23rd December 2016
