

The Commons Act 2006 - Schedule 3 para 2(b)
Application to amend the register to record an historic event

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by **Barbara Bond** and **Ralph Messenger** (“the Applicants”) to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority under Schedule 3 paragraph 2(b) of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014.

The application relates to common land register unit CL70 Burgh Marsh.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: The right to graze 5 stints (one stint equalling one beast or 2½ sheep, between 1st May and 28th October, sheep only to be grazed between 8 November and 28 March) and the right in the soil to cut turf and such rights of piscary as may be appurtenant thereto on Burgh Marsh comprising the whole of the land in this register unit (“the Right”) is currently registered as held in gross at Entry 46 of register unit CL70 in the name of Miss Mary Jane Carlile. The Applicants claim that by Deeds of Gift dated 18 August 1992 the Right was transferred to them to hold in equal shares of 2 ½ stints each. The Deeds of Gift do not operate at law to transfer the ownership of the Right until registered by the Commons Registration Authority in the register. The Applicants seek by this application to complete the transfer of ownership and register the Right in their own names.

If the application is granted, the registration authority will give effect to the determination by deleting the current entry (making reference to the new corresponding entries) and making new entries in the register to show the Applicants as owners of the Right.

Representations:

- must quote the Application No. **CA14/23**
- must state the name and postal address of the person making them, and the nature of that person’s interest (if any) in any land affected by the application and may include an e-mail address;
- must be signed by the person making them;
- must state the grounds on which they are made; and
- must be sent to: The Commons Registration Service, Lady Gillford’s House, Petteril Bank Road, Carlisle, Cumbria, CA1 3AJ.

Any representations made will not be treated as confidential, to determine the application it will be necessary for the commons registration authority to disclose information received to others, which will include the Applicant and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998). Representations may also be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The period for making representations expires at 5pm on 28 April 2017.


