Spokesperson:

“The Cybermoor project started about 3 years ago funded by the Wildlife Communities project with the remit to provide some 700 computers to members of the community here, which is a very isolated rural community, to try and see if we could help bridge the so-called digital divide.

That was successful, and today it's developed to a point where we now have some 350 members of the community hooked up to wireless broadband. It's the largest broadband community project in Britain, and is successfully providing a series of services and support facilities to members of the community.”

Interview with members of the community:

“It's helped me get a job, and it's also helped with my skills, and it helped with University a lot because I had work to do and I would have had to buy my own computer, and getting a computer for free really helped because I couldn't of afforded to do that. The broadband is so quick it means that if I need to discuss things with my lecturers or with other students I can do that really rapidly.”
