

Statistical Summary

Allerdale

July 2021

Allerdale has a population of 97,800; an increase of 1.6% over the last decade. 16.4% of the population are aged 0-15 years (lower than the national average of 19.2%), while 24.9% of the population are aged over 65 years (higher than the national average of 18.5%). Over the next decade the population of Allerdale is projected to increase by 1.3% (England +5%), while the district's age profile is projected to become older; with numbers of 0-15 and 16-64 year olds projected to decrease by 3.2% and 3.3% respectively (England -1.6% and +2.7%) as numbers of people aged 65+ are projected to increase by 15.6% (England + 19.6%).

There are 41,000 jobs at workplaces in Allerdale. The public administration, education and health sector accounts for the greatest proportion (21.4%). Wholesale and retail accounts for a further 17.1% followed by manufacturing (12.2%). Average annual earnings (full time) at workplaces in Allerdale are estimated to be £26,800, below the national average of £31,800. However, average annual earnings for residents in Allerdale are higher than for workplaces, standing at £33,300, slightly higher than the national average, reflecting the incidence of commuting to workplaces outside the district. The overall level of unemployment is below the national average (Allerdale = 3.9%, GB = 5.5%). Unemployment amongst young adults (aged 18-24) is also below the national average (Allerdale = 6.5%, GB = 7.2%). 27.9% of residents in Allerdale are estimated to be qualified to level 4 or higher, below the national average (43.1%); this is in part due to the occupational profile of employed residents in the borough.

Public Health England (PHE) report that average life expectancy in Allerdale is 79.6 years for males and 82.3 years for females; with female life expectancy significantly lower than the national average. The district also has significantly worse rates than the national average in relation to: mortality from cardiovascular diseases; killed and seriously injured (KSI) road casualties; maternal smoking status at time of delivery; and breastfeeding initiation. However, the district performs significantly better than the national average in relation to: admission episodes for alcohol-related conditions; physically active adults; hospital admissions for violence; new STI diagnoses; and TB incidence.

18.5% of children in Allerdale live in relative low income families. While this is similar to the national average (19.1%), there are some wards in the district where levels of child poverty are much higher than the national average; with the proportion of children in relative low income families in Moorclose & Moss Bay ward 1.4 times the national average (27.2%). 7 communities (LSOAs) in Allerdale fall within the 10% most deprived areas in England; these communities are located within: Moss Bay; Ewanrigg; St. Michael's; Moorclose; and Ellenborough. Generally, in these deprived areas unemployment and crime rates are high, while household incomes and educational attainment are low and health outcomes can be poor. Inversely, Allerdale has 3 LSOAs that are classified as being in the 10% least deprived of LSOAs nationally, these LSOAs are located in Christchurch, All Saints and Seaton.
