

Introduction

This briefing contains the latest data for Cumbria on the Claimant Count, Joblessness (UK only), job postings, business start-ups and Companies House incorporations and is produced monthly on the day that the Office for National Statistics (ONS) releases claimant data.

It should be noted that the “jobless” figures used extensively by the press are derived from a public survey. As this includes non-claimants looking for work, it can produce different trends to the claimant-only counts. However, the survey has too small a sample to be reliable for Cumbria and therefore all local data in this briefing are for claimants only and should not be compared to the national jobless figures. It should also be noted that JSA/UC data are revised monthly and therefore data in this briefing should not be directly compared with that in previous briefings.

NB: The claimant count was taken on 14th July 2016.

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1. KEY FINDINGS

Joblessness (UK only)

- The jobless total for the UK (claimants + non claimants looking for work) fell by 51,640 in the quarter to June 2016 and stood at 1.64m, 207,234 lower than a year ago and the lowest since Mar-May 2008;
- The UK jobless rate was 4.9%, down from 5.6% from a year ago and the lowest since July-Sept 2005.

National Seasonally Adjusted Claimant Data (UK only)

- The seasonally adjusted UK JSA claimant count was 763,586 in July 2016, down by 8,613 from last month and down 27,145 from the same month last year;
- The seasonally adjusted UK JSA claimant rate was 1.9% in July 2016, the same as last month.

Local Claimant Data

- In July 2016 there were 4,495 people in Cumbria claiming either JSA or Universal Credit (those not in employment), a fall of 55 from last month. Nationally the non-seasonally adjusted claimant count fell by 4,890. The count in Cumbria is 145 lower than a year ago;
- The claimant count fell from last month in all areas of Cumbria with the biggest numerical falls in Barrow (-20) and Copeland and South Lakeland (both -10);
- The claimant count in Carlisle and Eden is higher than a year ago but is lower in the other 4 districts and nationally;
- The claimant rate in July 2016 in Cumbria was 1.5% which is unchanged from last month and is 0.3 lower than the national rate of 1.8%;
- Barrow has the highest number of claimants at 1,090 and also the highest rate at 2.6%;

- Claimant rates are above the national average in Barrow and Copeland;
- Claimant rates for 18-24 year olds are higher in Cumbria as a whole than nationally, being almost double the national average in Barrow and also higher than nationally in Allerdale and Copeland.

Job Postings

- There were 9,442 job postings in Cumbria in the quarter to July 2016, 599 more than in the previous quarter and 161 more than the same quarter last year;
- The Carlisle area accounted for 35% of all job postings (2,530 postings);
- Human health had the highest number of postings with 1,440 (26%);
- Business & public service associate professionals were the most in demand occupation (850, 11%) followed by textiles, printing & other skills trades (682, 9%);
- Communication (32%) and organisational skills (21%) were the most commonly mentioned baseline skills with building relationships (13%) and customer service (12%) the most common specialised skills;
- The National Health Service placed the highest number of postings (619, 16%) followed by Centre Parcs (45, 1%);
- The highest proportion of jobs fell into the £20,000-£29,000 salary range (29%) with the mean advertised salary being £31,434;
- The most frequently required qualifications were GCSE (33%) and bachelor's degree (30%).

Business Start-Ups & Companies House Incorporations

- There were 581 business start-ups in Cumbria in the quarter to June 2016, 46 more than in the previous quarter but 113 fewer than the same quarter last year;
- The highest number of start-ups was in South Lakeland where there were 141 (24%);
- The sector with the highest number of start-ups was real estate, professional services & support services with 148 (26% of all start-ups);
- Barrow had the highest start up rate per 100 active enterprises with 14 starts per 100 active enterprises while Eden had the lowest at 8 per 100 active enterprises;
- South Lakeland and Eden had the highest start up rates as a proportion of working age residents with 100 and 88 per 10,000 working age residents respectively. Copeland had the lowest with 54 starts per 10,000 working age residents.
- There were 167 new Companies House incorporations in Cumbria in June 2016, up by 20 from the previous month but down by 28 from the same month last year;
- Carlisle had the most new incorporations (41) followed by South Lakeland (38).

2. NATIONAL LABOUR MARKET OVERVIEW

- Between January to March 2016 and April to June 2016, the number of people in work increased. The number of unemployed people and the number of people not working and not seeking or available to work (economically inactive) fell.
- There were 31.75 million people in work, 172,000 more than for January to March 2016 and 606,000 more than for a year earlier.
- There were 23.22 million people working full-time, 374,000 more than for a year earlier. There were 8.53 million people working part-time, 231,000 more than for a year earlier.
- The employment rate (the proportion of people aged from 16 to 64 who were in work) was 74.5%, the highest since comparable records began in 1971.
- There were 1.64 million unemployed people (people not in work but seeking and available to work), 52,000 fewer than for January to March 2016, 207,000 fewer than for a year earlier and the lowest since March to May 2008.
- There were 890,000 unemployed men, 124,000 fewer than for a year earlier. There were 750,000 unemployed women, 84,000 fewer than for a year earlier.

Labour Market Briefing August 2016

- The unemployment rate was 4.9%, down from 5.6% for a year earlier. The last time it was lower was for July to September 2005. The unemployment rate is the proportion of the labour force (those in work plus those unemployed) that were unemployed.
- There were 8.84 million people aged from 16 to 64 who were economically inactive (not working and not seeking or available to work), 58,000 fewer than for January to March 2016 and 179,000 fewer than for a year earlier.
- The inactivity rate (the proportion of people aged from 16 to 64 who were economically inactive) was 21.6%, the joint lowest since comparable records began in 1971.
- Average weekly earnings for employees in Great Britain in nominal terms (that is, not adjusted for price inflation) increased by 2.4% including bonuses and by 2.3% excluding bonuses compared with a year earlier.

4. CLAIMANT COUNT (JSA & Out of Work Universal Credit Claimants)

The claimant count in Cumbria in July 2016 was 4,495 persons, a fall of 55 from June. The claimant rate was unchanged at 1.5% which is below the UK rate of 1.8%. However, rates in Barrow and Copeland are above the national average. The non-seasonally adjusted count fell in all areas of Cumbria and also fell nationally.

Compared to a year ago, Cumbria's claimant count has fallen by 145 which is a fall of 3.1% compared to a fall of -3.5% nationally. Allerdale (-7.1%), Barrow (-5.5%) and South Lakeland (-6.0%) have all seen a bigger % fall than nationally but Carlisle (+1.7%) and Eden (+6.1%) have both seen a rise in the claimant count compared to a year ago.

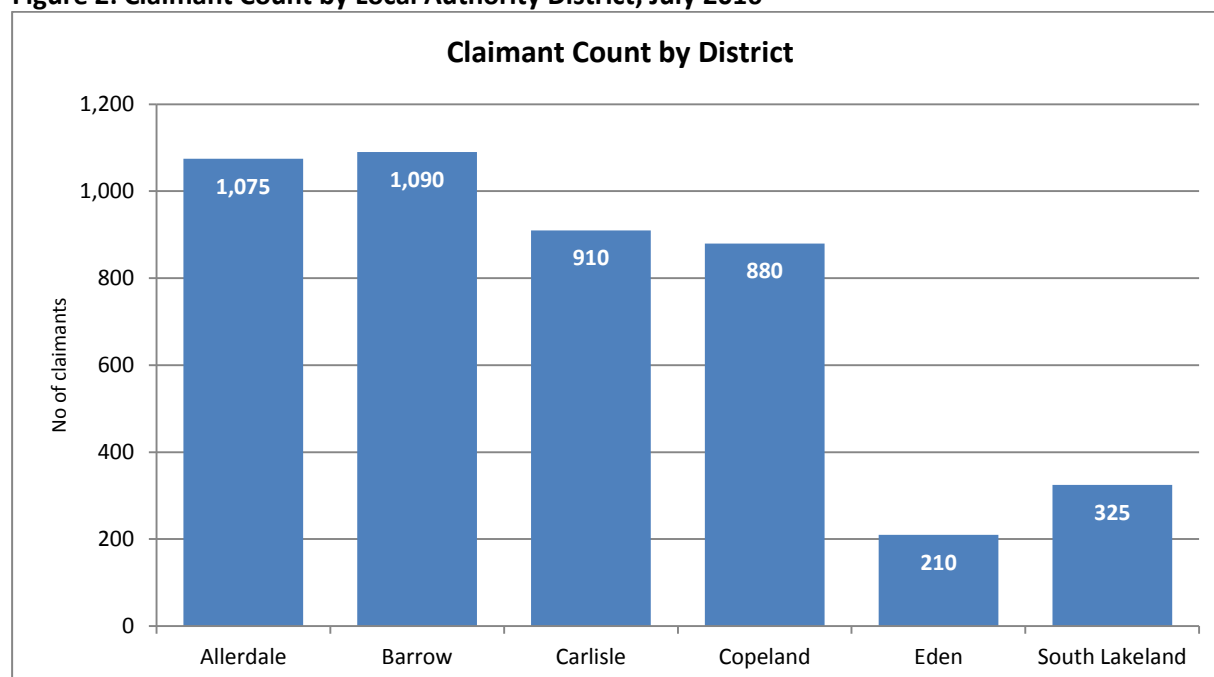
Figure 1: Claimant Count, July 2016

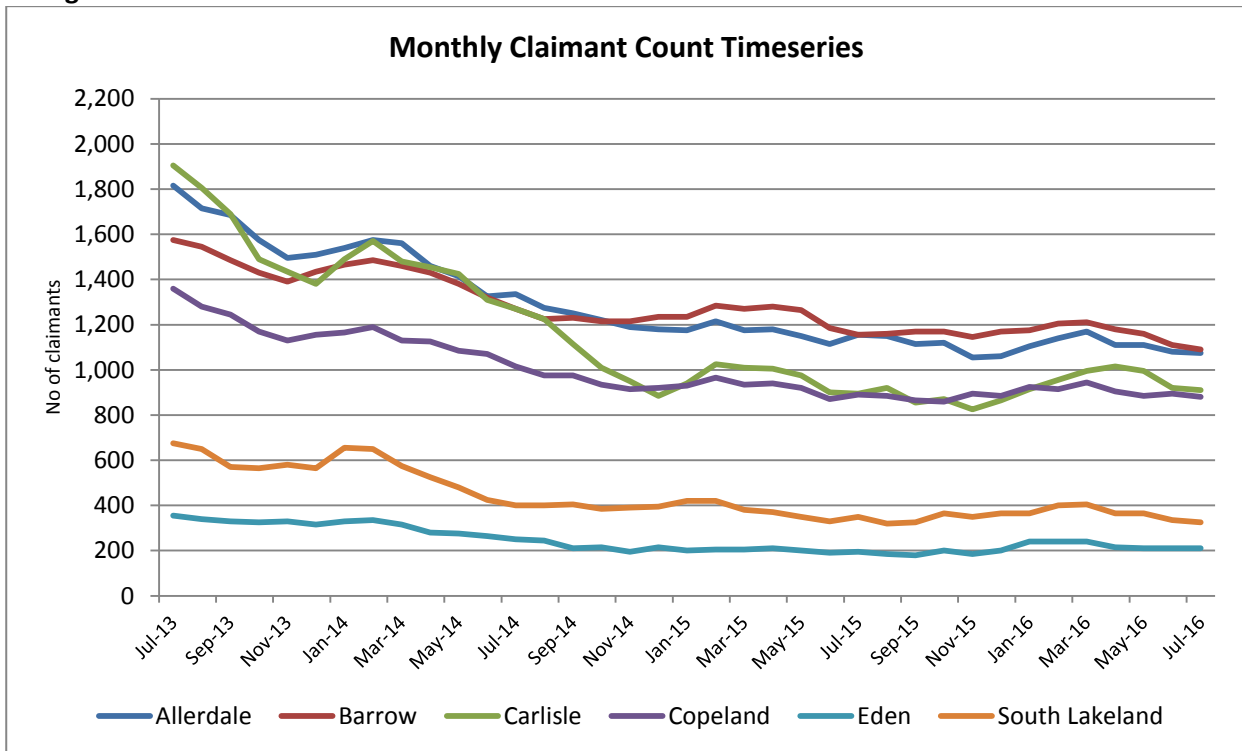

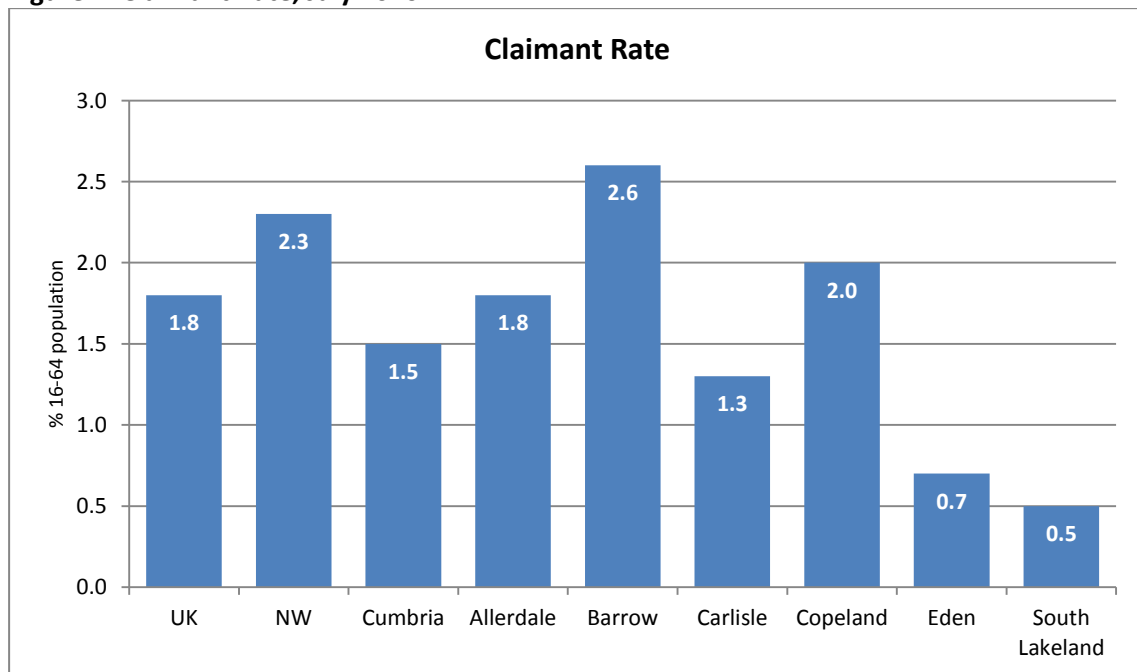
Figure 3: District Claimant Count Timeseries

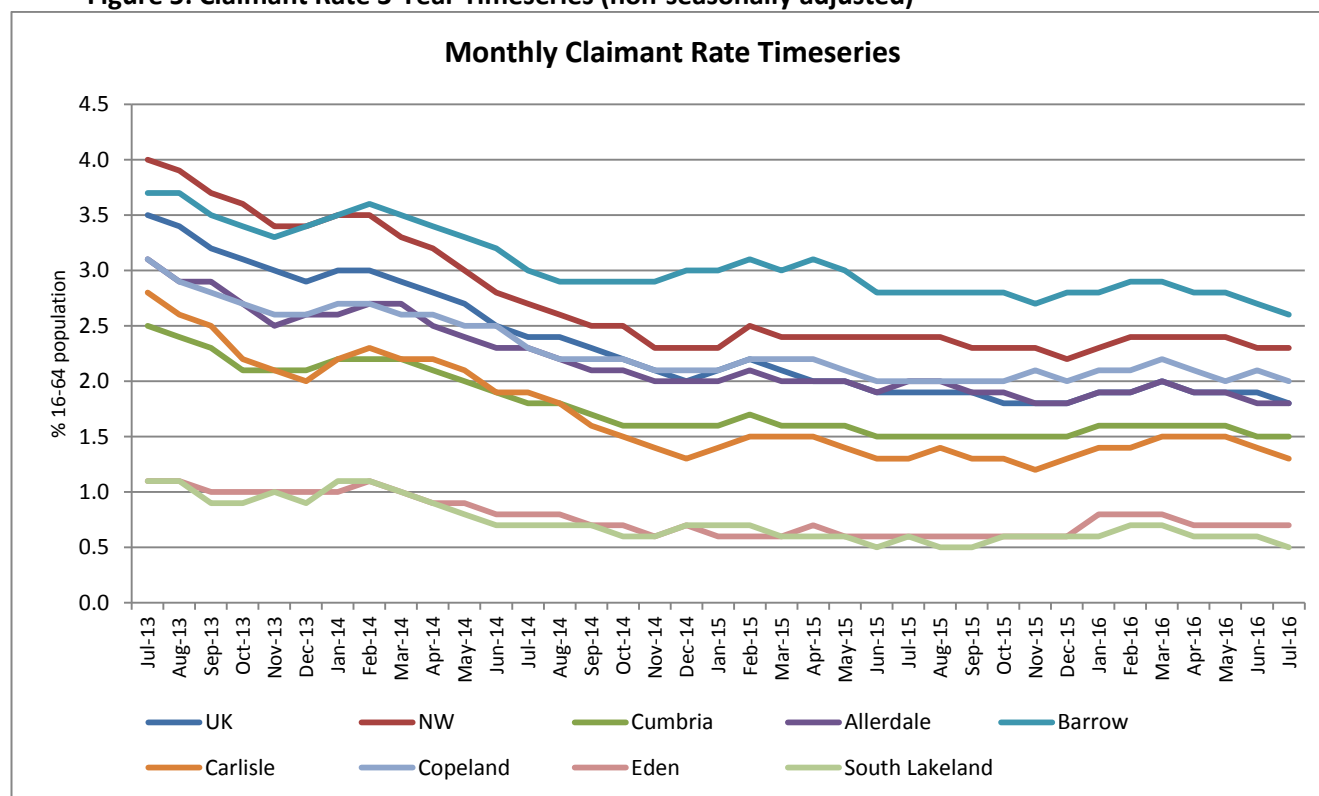

Figure 5: Claimant Rate 3-Year Timeseries (non-seasonally adjusted)



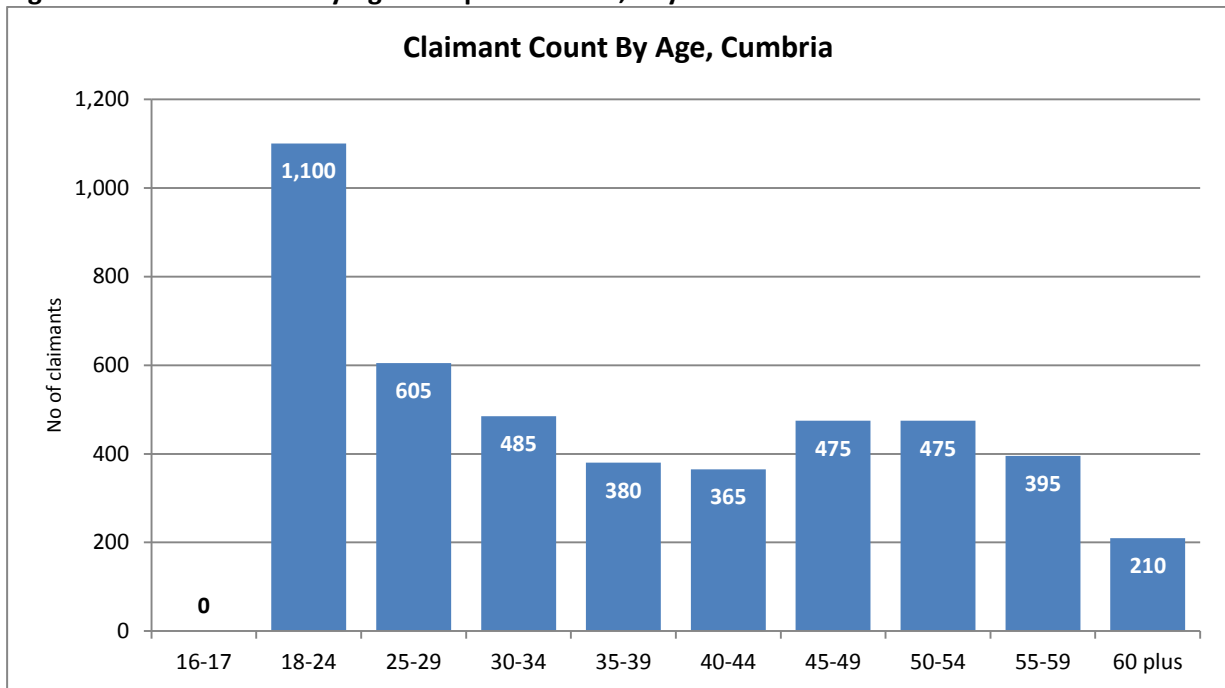

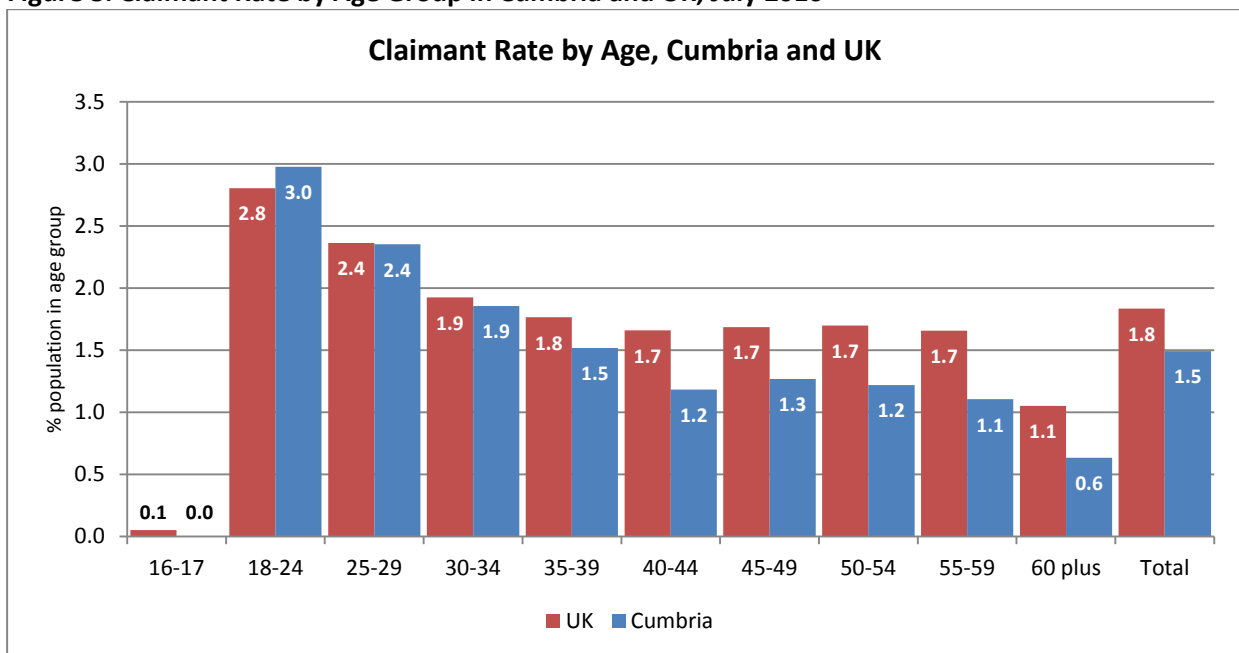

Figure 8: Claimant Rate by Age Group in Cumbria and UK, July 2016

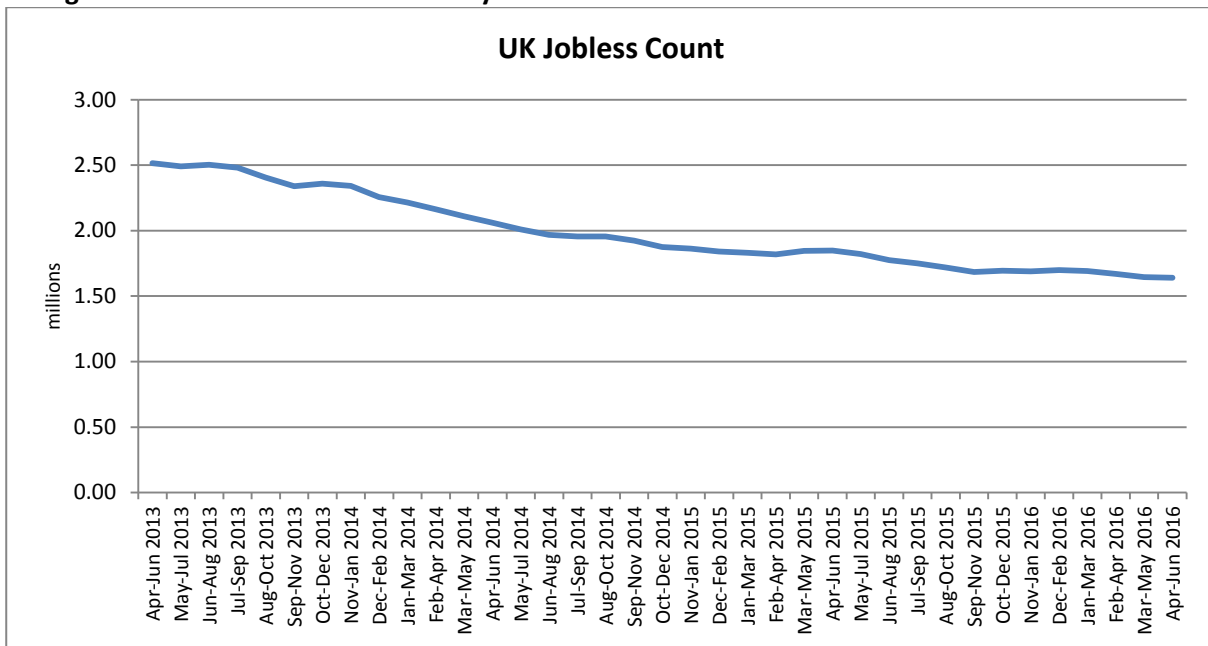

4. NATIONAL JOBLESS DATA (survey based, includes non-claimants)

The jobless total for the UK is calculated via the Labour Force Survey and measures claimants and non claimants who did not have a job but were actively seeking work in the previous 4 weeks and were available to start work. Jobless rates calculated from the survey use the economically active population as the denominator (ie those in work plus those actively seeking work). Due to sample sizes, no data are available for areas such as Cumbria.

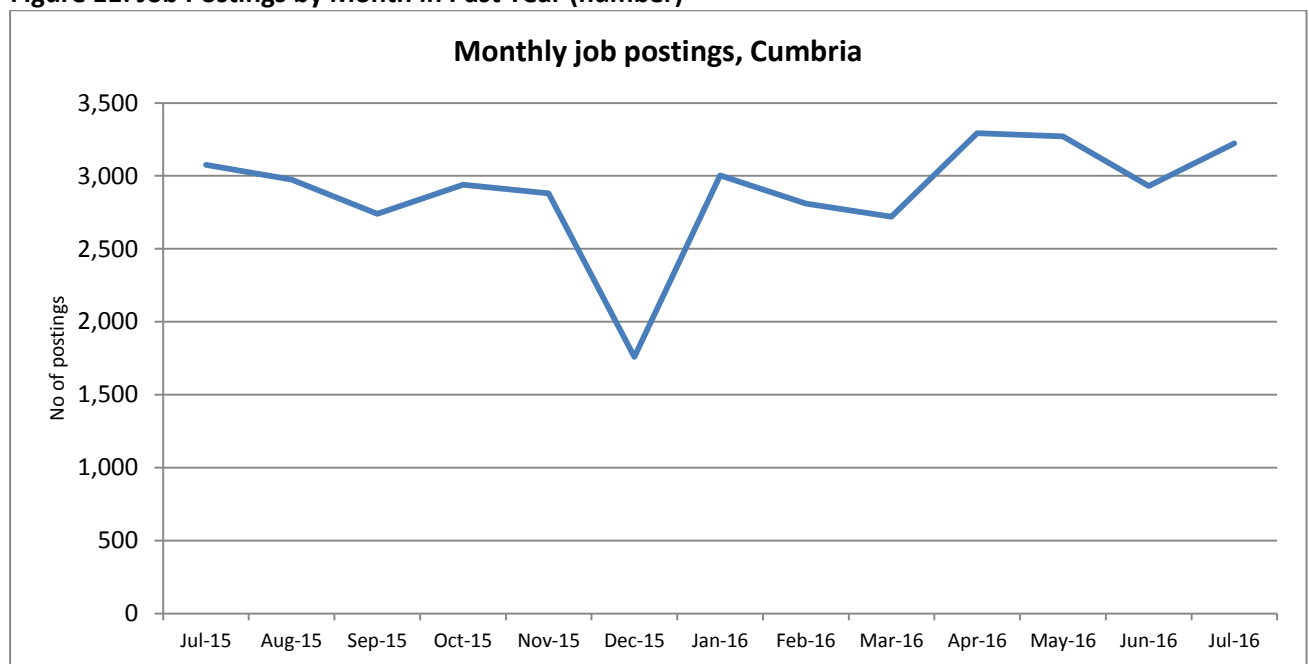
5. JOB POSTINGS

The following data are drawn from Labour Insight, an interactive tool which delivers real time access to job postings from a comprehensive range of sources including job boards, employer sites, newspapers, public agencies etc. Data extraction and analysis technologies mine and code data from each job listing to provide analysis on industries, occupations, skills and qualifications. The tool will inevitably not capture all vacancies and in particular is likely to under-represent vacancies in sectors which typically do not utilise online or formal recruitment methods. On the other hand it captures advertisements from agencies seeking to add people to their registers when there may not be a specific vacancy available which may over represent the situation in those sectors which make widespread use of recruitment agencies and “bank” workers.

In the period May-Jul 16, there were 9,442 job postings in Cumbria which is 599 more than were placed in the previous quarter (Feb-Apr 16) and 161 more than the same quarter last year.

The volume of postings dipped significantly in November and December which is a trend seen in previous years but rose again in January with little sign that the recent floods have impacted significantly on recruitment activity.

Figure 11: Job Postings by Month in Past Year (number)

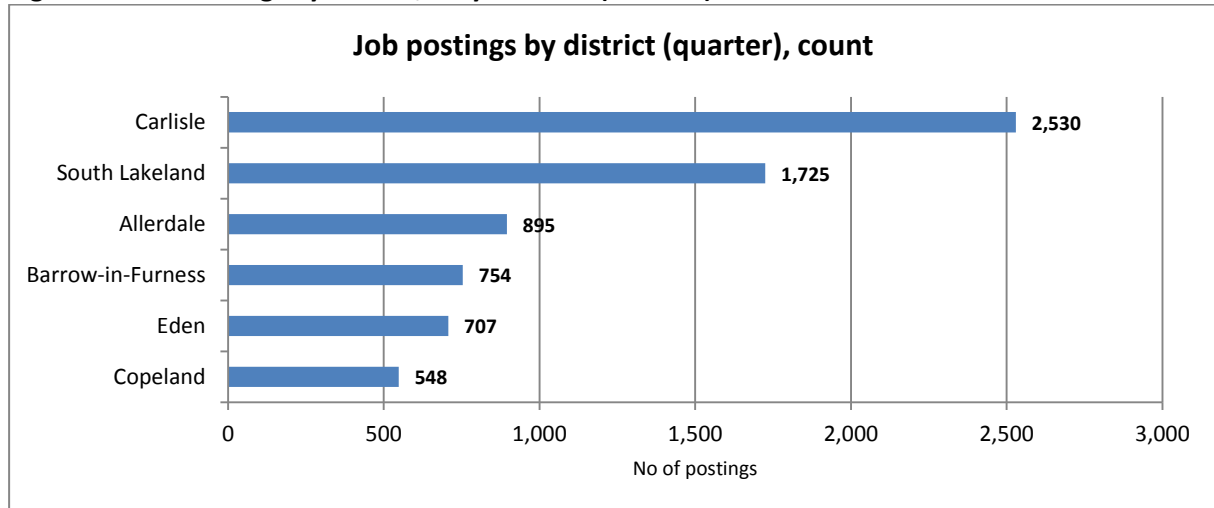

Location of job postings

Geographically the highest number of postings in the quarter was for opportunities in Carlisle where there were 2,530 postings in the quarter, 35% of all the postings in Cumbria. The second highest number of postings was in South Lakeland (1,725) with 24% of the total.

Figure 12: Job Postings by District, May-Jul 2016 (number)



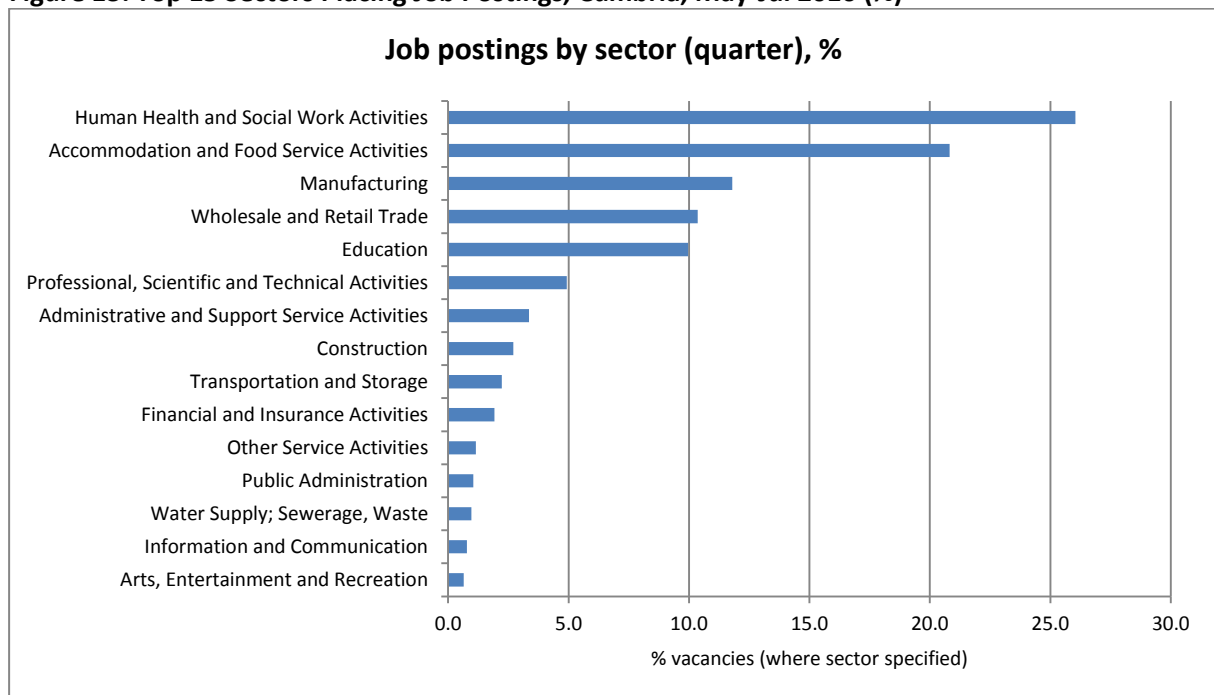

Sector of job postings

The highest number of postings was in the human health & social work sector (1,440 postings) which represented a quarter of postings where a sector could be identified (26%). The next most common sectors were accommodation & food (1,151, 21%) and manufacturing (652, 12%).

Figure 13: Top 15 Sectors Placing Job Postings, Cumbria, May-Jul 2016 (%)

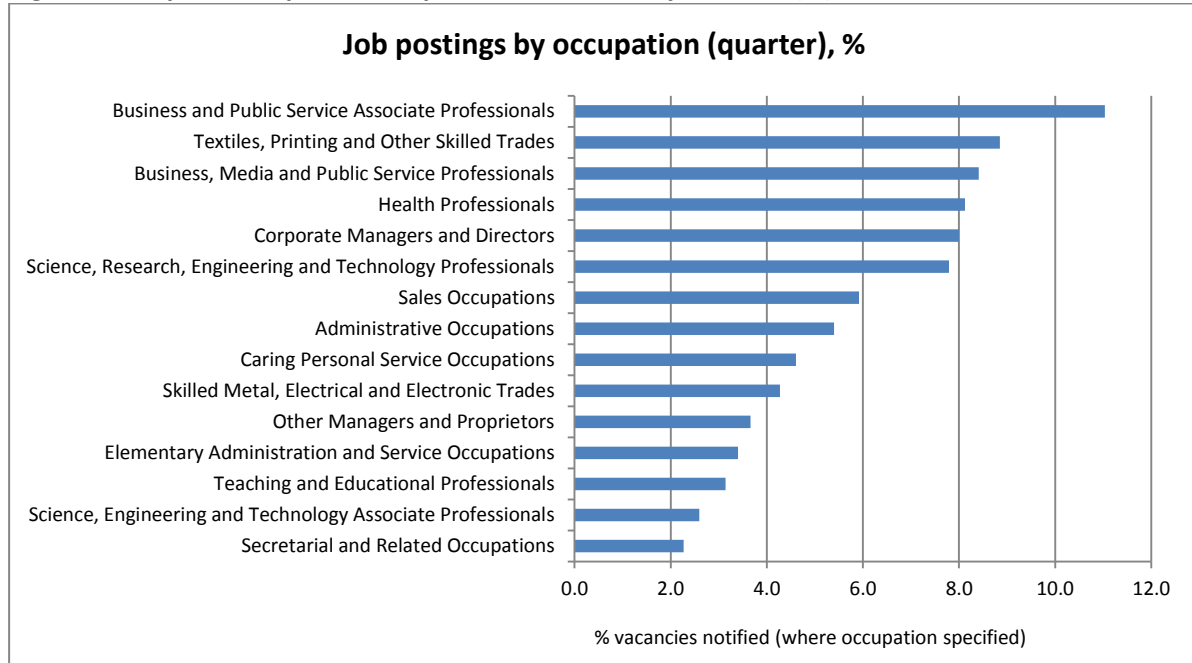

Occupation of job postings

The most common occupations specified were business & public service associate professionals (850, 11%), textiles, printing & other skilled trades (682, 9%) and business, media & public service professionals (648, 8%).

Figure 14: Top 15 Occupations Required, Cumbria, May-Jul 2016 (%)

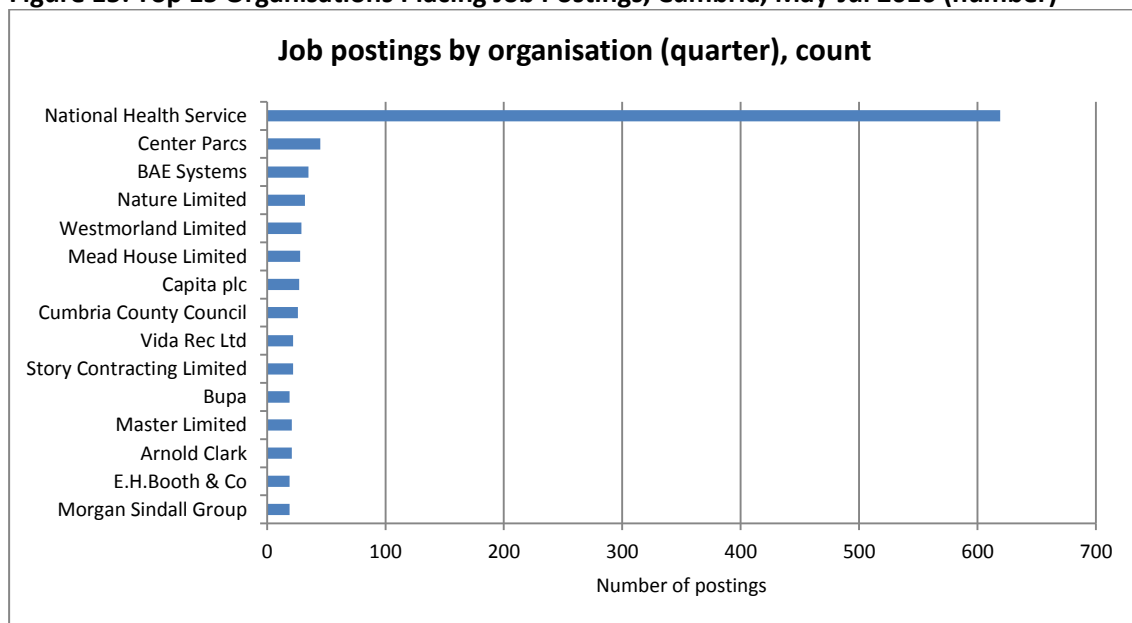

Organisations placing job postings

The organisation placing the most job postings in the quarter was the National Health Service with 619 postings (16%) followed by Centre Parcs with 45 (1%).

Figure 15: Top 15 Organisations Placing Job Postings, Cumbria, May-Jul 2016 (number)

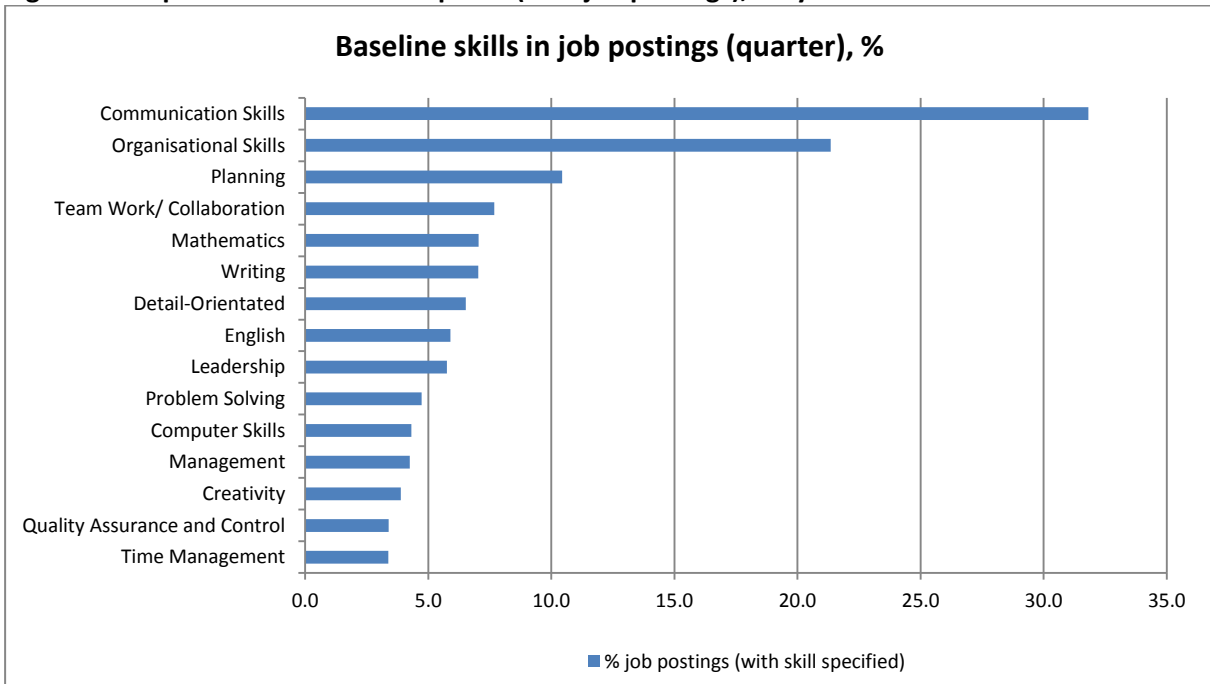

Skills mentioned in job postings

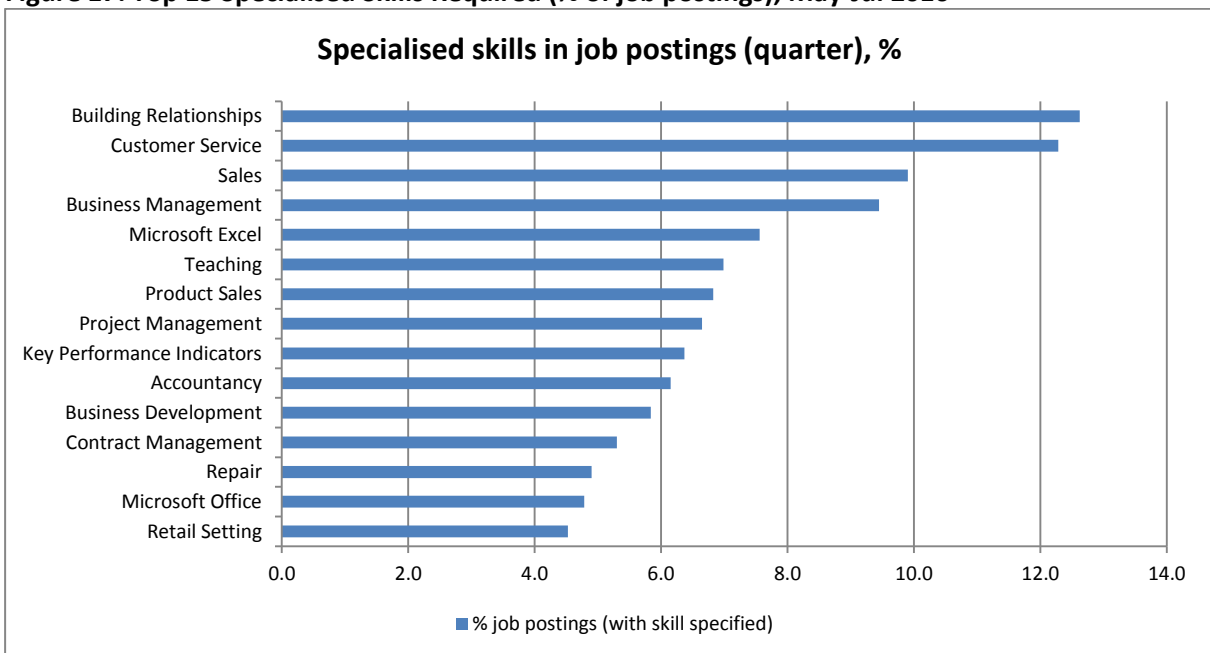
The most common baseline skills mentioned in the quarter were communication (1,603 mentions, 32% of all postings with skills specified) and organisational skills (1,076, 21%) whilst the most commonly mentioned more detailed skills were building relationships (636, 13%) and customer service (619, 12%).

Figure 17: Top 15 Specialised Skills Required (% of job postings), May-Jul 2016

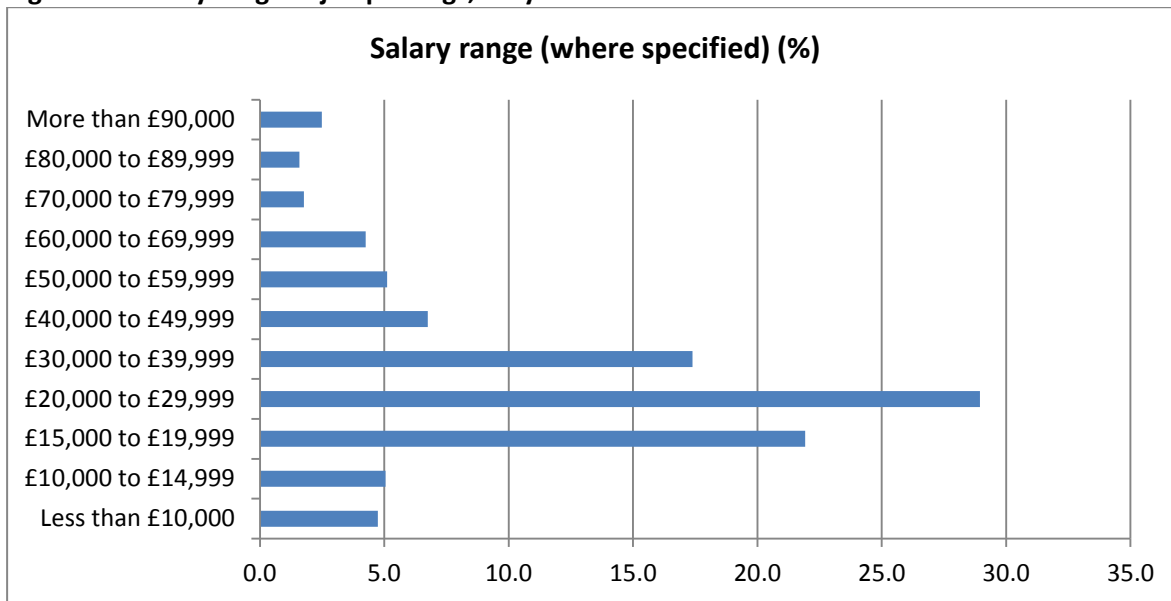

Salaries offered in job postings (where provided)

Only around half the postings identified a salary range but where they did, the highest proportion fell into the £20,000-£29,999 range (29%). A fifth fell into the £15,000-£19,999 range and one in six fell into the £30,000-£39,999 range. The mean salary quoted was £31,434.

Figure 18: Salary range in job postings, May-Jul 2016

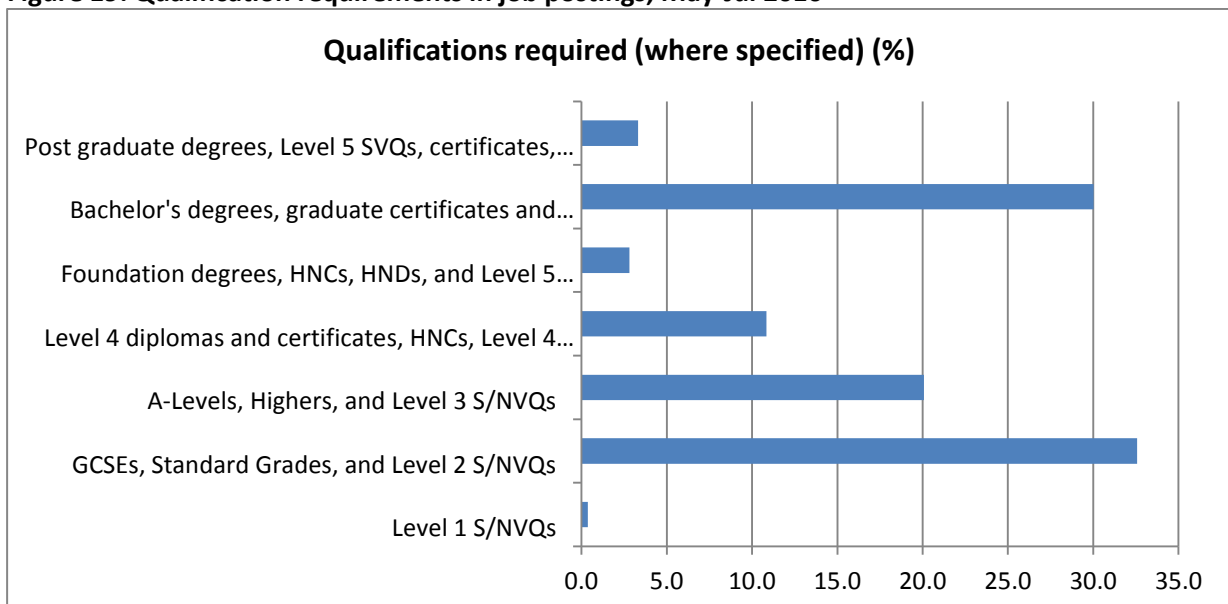

Qualification requirements in job postings (where provided)

Only around 1 in 6 job postings referred to the qualifications required for the job but where they did so, the most frequently mentioned were GCSE level (33%) and bachelor's degree level (30%).

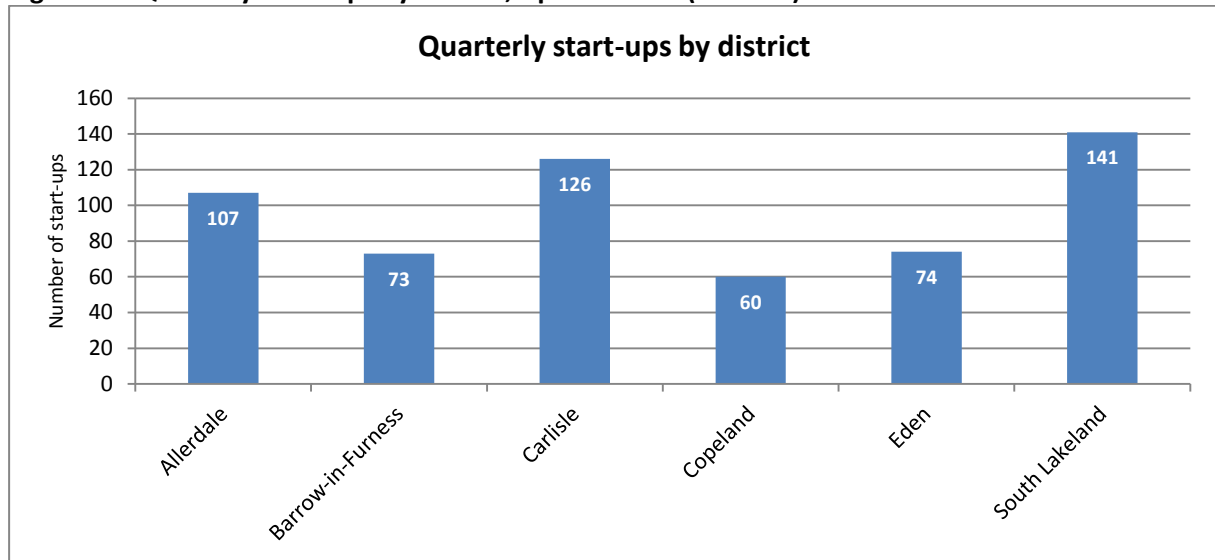
Note: The tool relies on data contained within job postings when analysing skill needs, qualifications etc and this may be limited by the accuracy and detail contained within the original advertisement. For example, the system can allocate an occupation in the majority of instances but is unable to allocate an industry in approximately a third of cases. Therefore the totals for each may vary and proportions presented here are of postings where the relevant coding has been possible.

6. BUSINESS START UPS

The following data are from BankSearch, a survey which collects data from Barclays, Co-operative Bank, HSBC, Lloyds Banking Group, Royal Bank of Scotland Group, Santander and TSB Bank. A 'start-up' reflects the opening of a first current account from a small business banking product range by a business new to banking or previously operated through a personal account. The data exclude businesses operating through personal accounts, those without banking relationships or those banking with other institutions.

There were 581 business start-ups in Cumbria in the quarter Apr-Jun 16. This is 46 more than in the previous quarter (Jan-Mar 16) but 113 fewer than the same quarter last year. The highest number of start-ups, 141 was in South Lakeland (24% of all start-ups) followed by Carlisle (126, 22%).

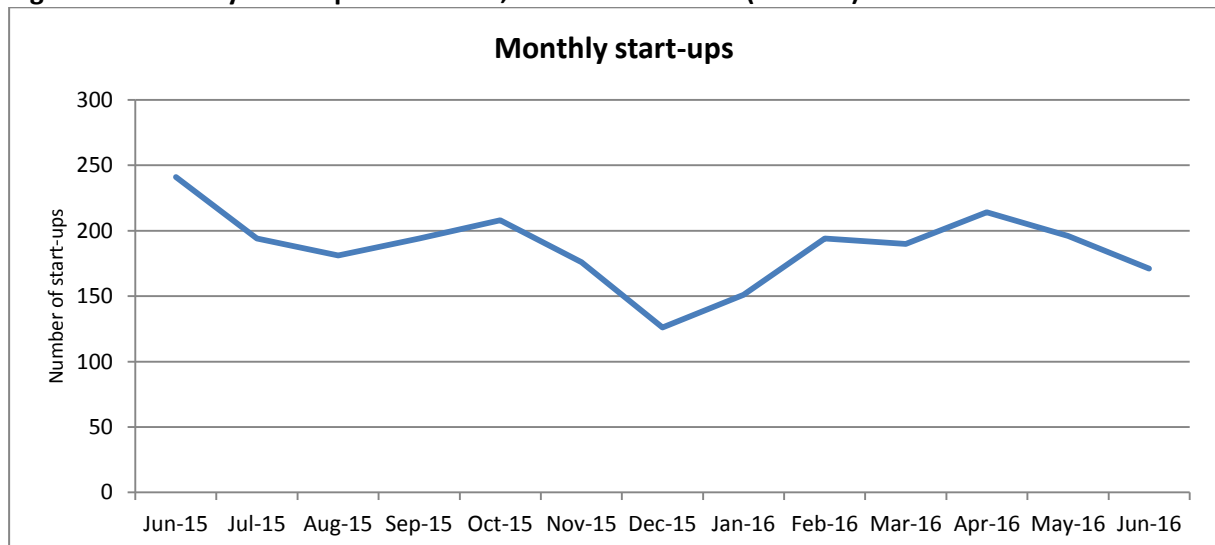
Figure 21: Quarterly Start-Ups by District, Apr-Jun 2016 (number)

The number of starts peaked in Spring 2015 but fell in the summer before experiencing a slight recovery in the Autumn. November and December levels were below those of the previous year but there was evidence of recovery in January which has continued through the Spring but there are signs of a slow down as we enter the summer period..

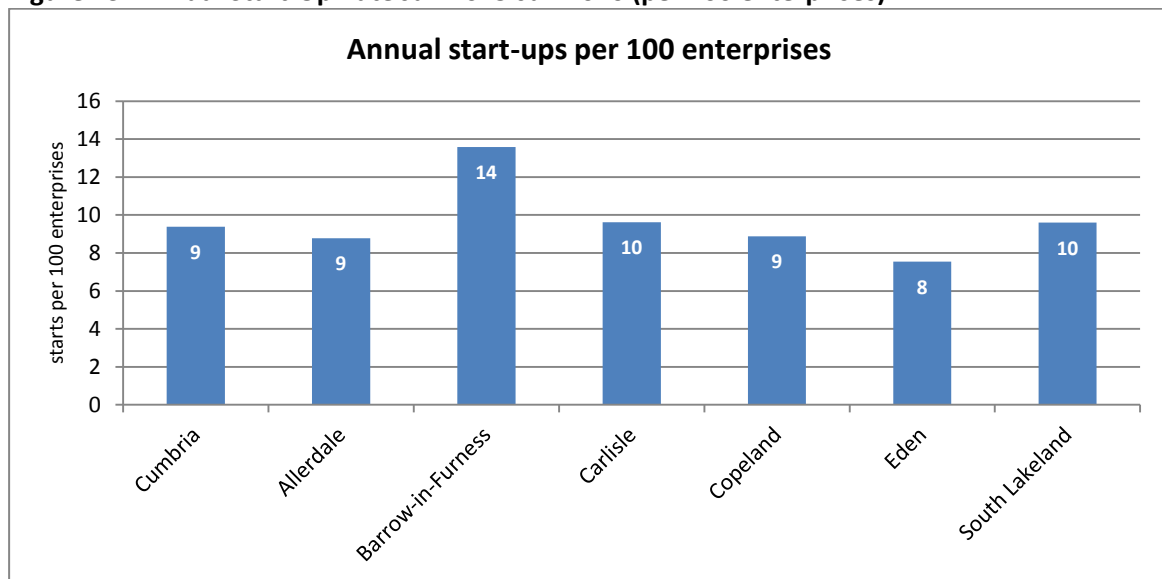
Figure 22: Monthly Start-Ups in Cumbria, Jun 2015-Jun 2016 (number)

The annual rate of business start-ups can be expressed in 2 ways. Firstly, as a proportion of the active business stock. This measure is influenced by the business structure and areas with a relatively small opening stock of active businesses will generally show higher start up rates than those with large volumes, often of small, businesses. The second method is start-ups per 10,000 working age people and is sometimes regarded as a better indicator of entrepreneurship amongst local residents. Using the first methodology of starts per 100 enterprises (which is the Office for National Statistics' preferred measure) Barrow had the highest annual start up rate at 14 per 100 active enterprises while Eden had the lowest at 8 per 100 active enterprises.

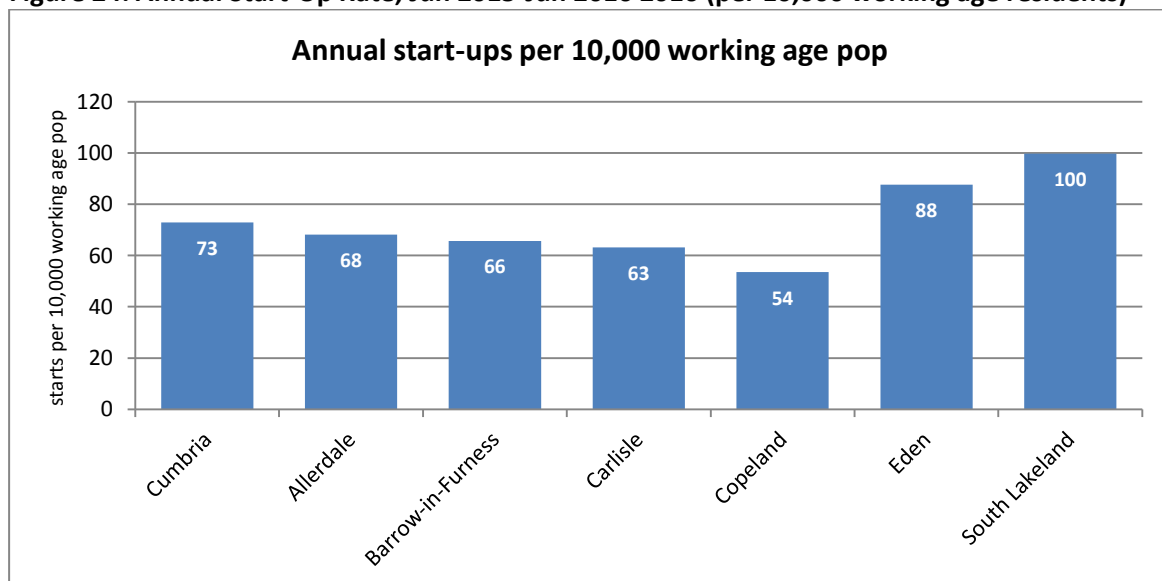
Figure 23: Annual Start-Up Rate Jun 2015-Jun 2016 (per 100 enterprises)

Using the second methodology (starts per 10,000 working age residents), the position is different with South Lakeland having the highest start up rate at 100 per 10,000 working age residents and Copeland having the lowest at 54 per 10,000 working age residents.

Figure 24: Annual Start-Up Rate, Jun 2015-Jun 2016 (per 10,000 working age residents)

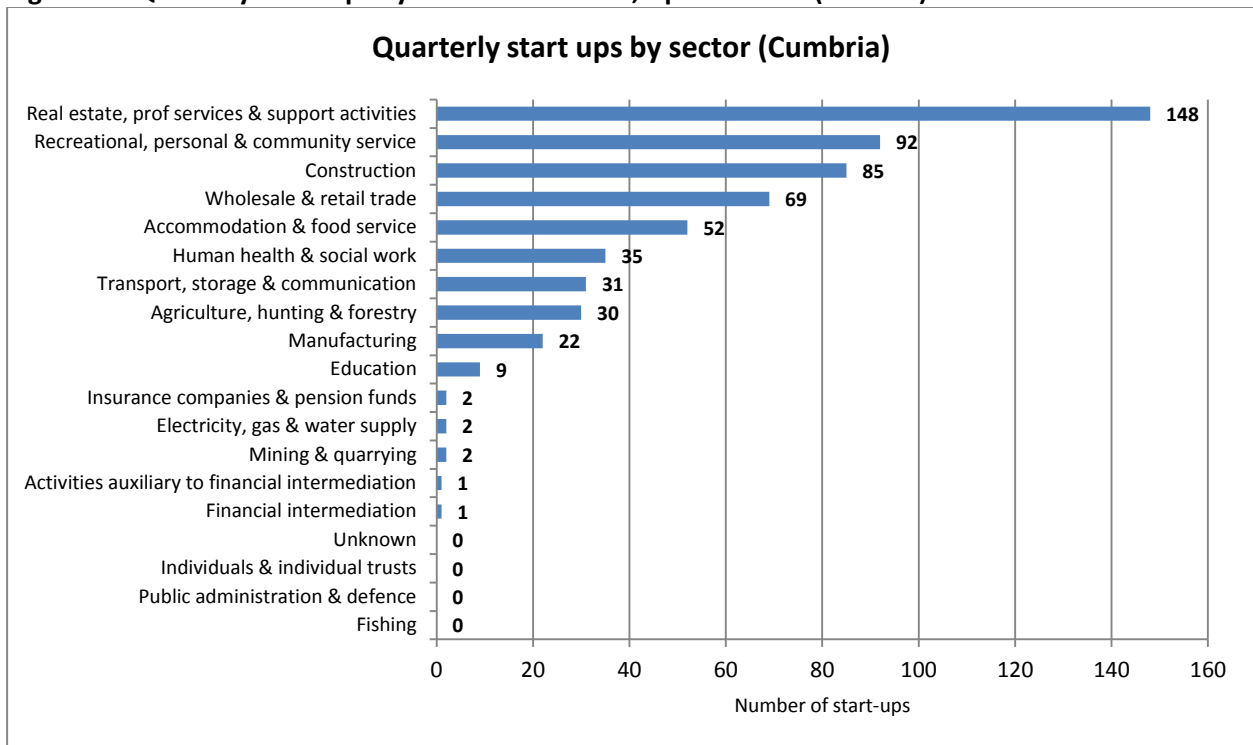

As is generally the case, the highest number of start-ups was in the real estate & professional services sector with 148 (26%). This was followed by recreation, personal & community services with 92 (16%) and construction with 85 (15%).

The sectors experiencing the biggest numerical rise in start-ups were real estate & professional services (+15) and recreation & personal services (+13) compared to last quarter.

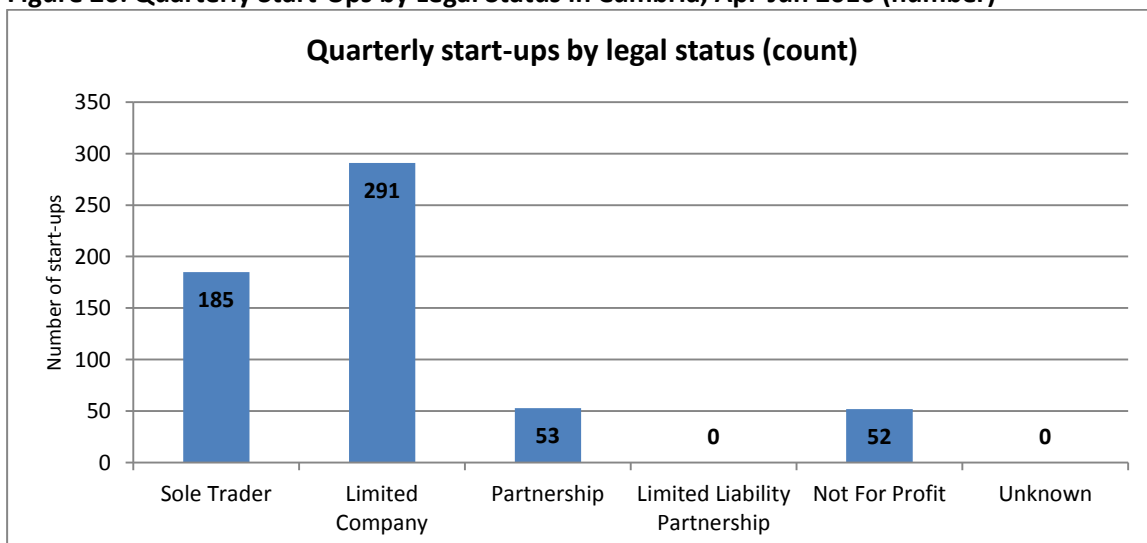
Figure 25: Quarterly Start-Ups by Sector in Cumbria, Apr-Jun 2016 (number)

Figure 26: Quarterly Start-Ups by Legal Status in Cumbria, Apr-Jun 2016 (number)

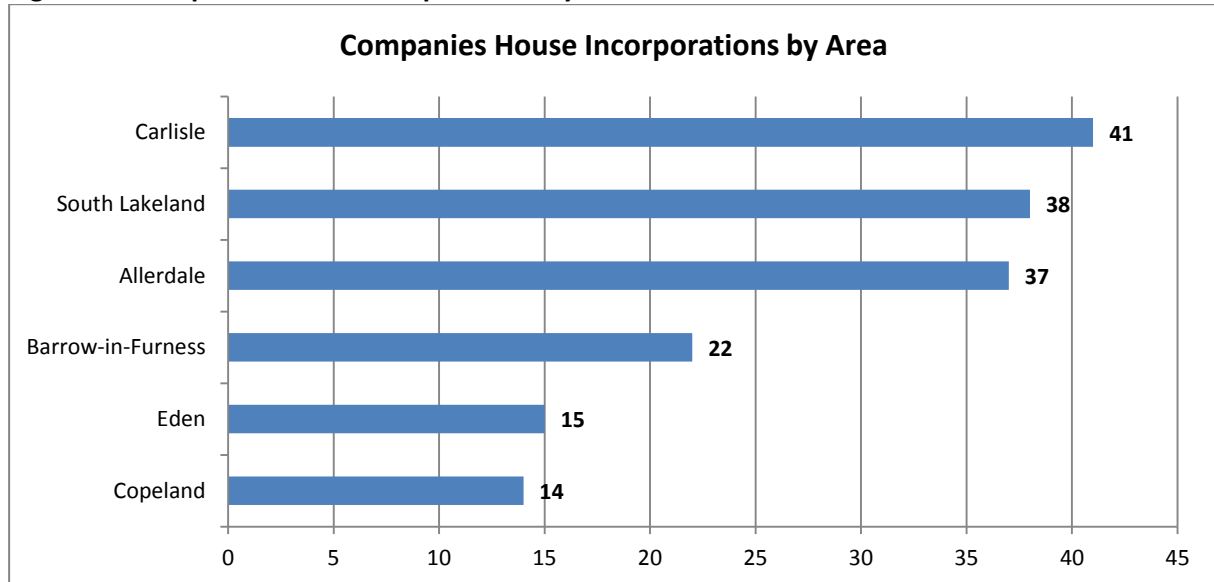

7. COMPANIES HOUSE INCORPORATIONS

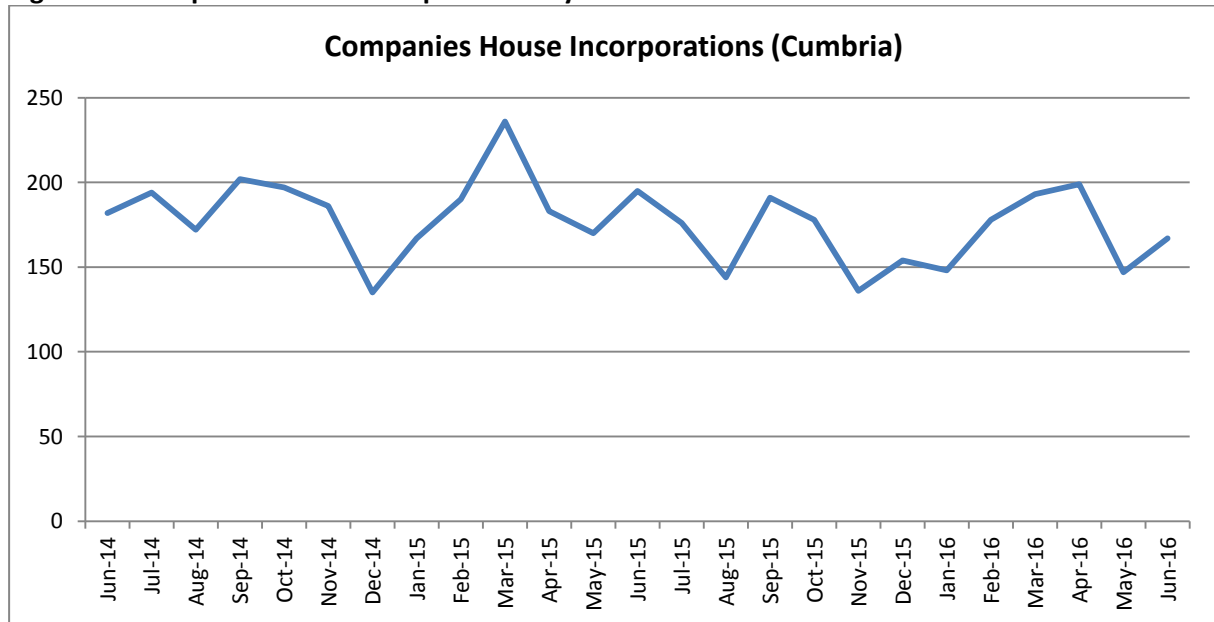
There were 167 new Companies House incorporations in May 2016, up by 20 from the previous month but 28 lower than the same month last year. The highest number was in Carlisle (41), followed by South Lakeland (38). There is a lot of fluctuation in monthly totals but historically there are always peaks in March and September and then a dip in summer and in the run up to Christmas.
