Introduction



We recommend before you view these webinars you take a look at the brief introduction. It gives an overview of basic child development and some information about changes to the EYFS.

Birth to three - is broken down into two parts:-

0 - 2 years

This section includes the importance of attachment, brain and sensory development.



2 years

This section includes what it means to be two, the rapid development of prime areas of learning and the importance of an environment which supports the development of independence skills.

3 - 4 years - broken down into three parts:-

Personal, social and emotional -


An introduction looks at what is self-regulation, managing self and building relationships.

Physical development -

The importance of developing core strength and balance in order to be ready to write

Communication and language -

Includes developing listening skills and the importance of stories and rhymes.



4 - 5 years - this is in two parts focusing on children in reception:-



1. This section includes cognitive development, pedagogy and communication and language development.

2. This section includes personal, social, emotional and physical development. Also includes gross and fine motor skills to enable children to use a range of implements and tools effectively.
