#### What's new?

#### **Updated Chapters:**

<u>Allegations Against Staff or Volunteers</u> This chapter was updated to reflect working Together 2015, in particularly Section 2, Roles and Responsibilities.

Information Sharing Protocol An updated version was added.

<u>Abuse Linked to Faith or Belief</u> A link was added to the The Safe Network website which contains information on Abuse in Faith Settings in the Further Information section.

<u>Child Sexual Exploitation</u> An updated version of Cumbria LSCB Child Sexual Exploitation Policy and Procedure and Appendix 6: Multi-Agency Safety Plan were added.

<u>Children from Abroad</u> This chapter was updated to reflect Care of unaccompanied and trafficked children: Statutory guidance for local authorities on the care of unaccompanied asylum seeking and trafficked children (2014). Where the age of a person is uncertain and there are reasons to believe that they are a child, they are presumed to be a child in order to receive immediate access to assistance, support and protection. Age assessments should not be a routine part of a local authority's assessment of unaccompanied or trafficked children. Where age assessments are conducted, they must be Merton Compliant.

<u>Children Missing from Education</u> This chapter was extensively updated and should be read throughout.

<u>Children of Parents who Misuse Substances</u> A link was added to Postnatal Care – NICE Clinical Guideline 37 in the Further Information section.

<u>E-Safety: Children Exposed to Abuse through the Digital Media</u> This chapter was updated to reflect the issue of social media and radicalisation. Information was also added with regards to The Serious Crime Act (2015) which introduced an offence of sexual communication with a child.

<u>Female Genital Mutilation</u> A link was added to the Female Genital Mutilation: Resource Pack (GOV.UK) in the Further Information section.

All Safeguarding Practice Guidance should be read in conjunction with this chapter.

<u>Supporting Children and Young People Vulnerable to Violent Extremism and Radicalisation</u> This document is intended to provide summary information to all partners on the procedures for identifying and dealing with children and young people vulnerable to violent extremism and radicalisation.
