The Winterbourne work



- Transforming Care: A national response to Winterbourne View Hospital
- Winterbourne View Joint Improvement Programme
- North East and Cumbria Winterbourne Implementation Group
- Reviews & plans to be done by 1 June 2013
- People receive personalised care and support in appropriate community settings no later than 1 June 2014

The regional Winterbourne work



- Reviews all done!
- Now checking they were good and involved people with learning disability and their families
- Going to check the plans make sense
- Telling Clinical Commissioning Groups and Directors of Social Services where we're up to, what the risks are and some options to choose from

Joint Health and Social Care SAF



- To be done by 30 Nov 13
- **Staying Healthy-** This includes lots of things such as getting a good service from the doctors, chemist, dentists or when going to hospital.
- **Being Safe-** This includes lots of things such as in their own home, in hospital or out and about where they live
- **Living Well-** This is about lots of things such as having a say about how services should be or being welcomed by their community
