Latest News

On 27 March 2017 the Secretary of State announced her decision to approve a stretch of the England Coast Path in Cumbria around Walney Island.

Also on this day we announced we are beginning to investigate how to improve coastal access along the 124km stretch between Cleveleys and Pier Head, Liverpool and the 41 km stretch between Birkenhead and the Welsh border.

Training workshop for new access authority contacts on final two stretches has been organised set for early April.

 Window for objections and representations now closed and all such received during the eight weeks have been passed to an inspector from the Planning Inspectorate, appointed by the Secretary of State. The inspector is now working through the cases and will make recommendations to the Secretary of State in respect of each one. 	 The Secretary of State's decision is expected in summer 2017. Establishment work will get underway as soon as possible, but may run into at least 2018/19, before access rights can be commenced.
