



WHY START A PRIDE YOUTH NETWORK?

The PYN will enable you and your friends to increase the visibility of lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans identities in the school environment.

The PYN encourages pupil voice and ensures that students are part of the journey to LGBT+Inclusion.

The PYN provides a safe space for LGBT+ students and their friends to meet, discuss and campaign for equality in the school environment and beyond.

WE WELCOME DIFFERENT GENDER IDENTITIES AND SEXUAL ORIENTATIONS IN OUR SCHOOL!

A PYN IS CREATED TO ...

SUPPORT EACH OTHER

A PYN provides support for students whether they are LGBT+ or not.

A PYN promotes inclusion through organizing events and activities for everyone both in and out of school.

A PYN builds a sense of community where individuals are respected regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity, helping all LGBT+ students feel included and represented.

MAKE POSITIVE INSTITUTIONAL CHANGE

Your PYN can be a great asset in educating the school community about different sexual orientations and gender identities through assemblies, increasing visibility through display and notice boards.

HOW TO START

FIND LIKE-MINDED PEOPLE

Enlist a group of friends and allies to help set up your PYN. The more the merrier!

Let the pastoral team, school mentors and the anti-bullying team know that you are setting up a PYN as they will be really keen to support you.

The pastoral teams are also 'in the know' and will be able to help you find other interested students...

They will also have inside knowledge on what the school is able to provide you with, such as a room to meet and any equipment you may need.



SECURE SOME ADULT SUPPORT


Find a teacher or staff member who will be supportive or who you already know is a supporter of LGBT+ who can act as your link teacher. It could be a member of teaching staff, a mentor, an LSA, librarian or any other staff member. Your link teacher can then inform other teachers, parent groups and the governing body.

INFORM THE SCHOOL OF YOUR PYN

Ask for help from your link teacher to arrange a meeting with the Head-teacher, a member of the senior leadership team or a governor to make sure you have the go ahead.

If you come across barriers when forming your PYN, please let them know that your group is protected under the Equality Act 2010 and OFSTED criteria which advocates for schools to eradicate discrimination.







MEETINGS

CHOOSE A MEETING PLACE AND TIME

You should find a meeting place in the school that you can use consistently. Probably best that this is somewhere quiet and accessible.
Your link teacher will help facilitate this.

ADVERTISE

Use existing school frameworks to promote your PYN. It may be a combination of bulletins, newsletters, fliers, posters, word- of-mouth or if you're feeling brave, maybe get a shout-out in an assembly or ask your link teacher to do this for you.

The best way to encourage participation and make new friends is to promote your group as fun and welcoming. Food is always a bonus!.

Ask your link teacher if you can use some of your schools facilities for free, like printers, paper and photocopiers. You can begin to raise money for yo group through campaigning and events.

TIP: Get a school governor on your side



POLICIES

ESTABLISH GROUND RULES

This will ensure that group discussions are safe, confidential, and respectful.

Your rules could be:

- No assumptions or labels to be used about a group member's sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Respect everyone's ideas.
- To have as much fun as possible whilst being proactive!

DO YOU HAVE A SCHOOL CODE?


Does it state to treat everyone Equally and Fairly according to The Equality Act 2010? A good idea is to state all the protected characteristics so we know who 'everyone' is, including sexual orientation and gender Identity as well as race, religion, gender, disa-bilities, age, marriage and pregnancy.



STARTING UP

- ♦ Make the school code visible
- ♦ Secure a PYN notice board in school

- Hold an event/activity for IDAHOT May 17th
- ♦ Hold 1 fundraising event
- ♦ Hold 1 non-school-based event/activity that involves the community

A GUIDE FOR STAFF

A PRIDE Youth Network (PYN) is designed to empower students to engage in creating positive whole school change to eradicate discrimination.

A PYN is one of the ways you can develop pupil voice by giving students opportunities to initiate campaigns and ensuring their voices are heard as part of the decision making process within the school.

Encouraging student activism through a PYN can help you create an LGBT+Friendly school as well as being part of a national network that will support and inspire.

Creating a PYN is simple yet the benefits are invaluable and plentiful not only for students who identify as LGBT+ but noticeably for the whole school community. Everyone benefits from a school environment that welcomes all.

The PYN will lead events, fundraisers, showcases and campaigns, as well as ensuring the school is adhering to the Educate & Celebrate Best Practice Programme including; keeping up-to-date and using correct language, usualising LGBT+ people in the curriculum and creating LGBT+ notice boards and display.

The group will enable both LGBT+ and non-LGBT+ students to work together, make new friends, have fun and be a part

of something that will leave a positive legacy for years to come.

What can the school do to help initiate a PYN?

Safety & Security

- 1. Provide a space for meetings.
- 2. Ensure students who are part of the PYN feel safe
- 3. Check that all organized events by the PYN meet with school regulations
- 4. Make sure that all social media and external relations are within the guidelines set out by Educate & Celebrate and the School

Support & Guidance


- 1. Offer positive encouragement and advice to students wanting to start a PYN.
- 2. Help provide or find materials if necessary e.g. paper, pens, tables, signage, promotion for meetings and events.
- 3. Promote the PYN to teachers, staff and governors.
- 4. Assist the students in finding space for meetings, events and displays.
- 5. Encourage the students to engage fully in the PYN aims and steps as laid out in this document.














PRIDE Youth Networks
