

# Cumbria

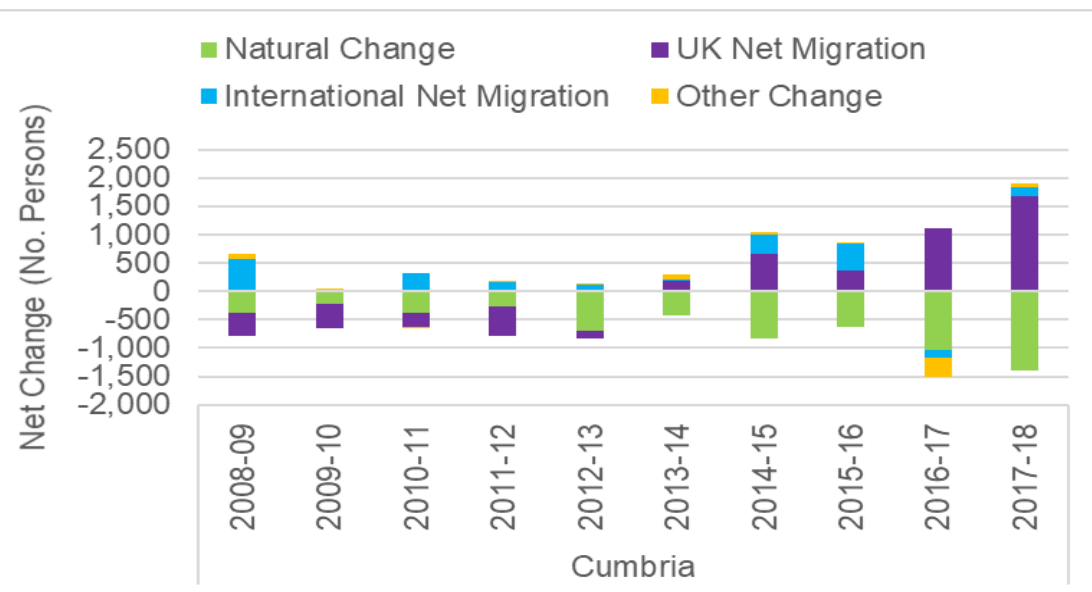
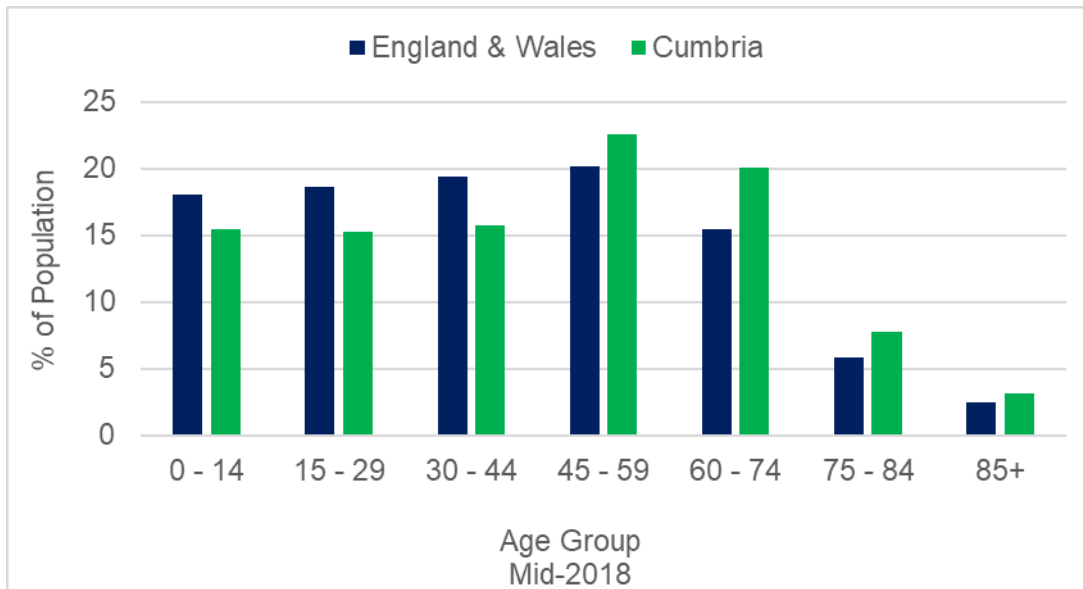
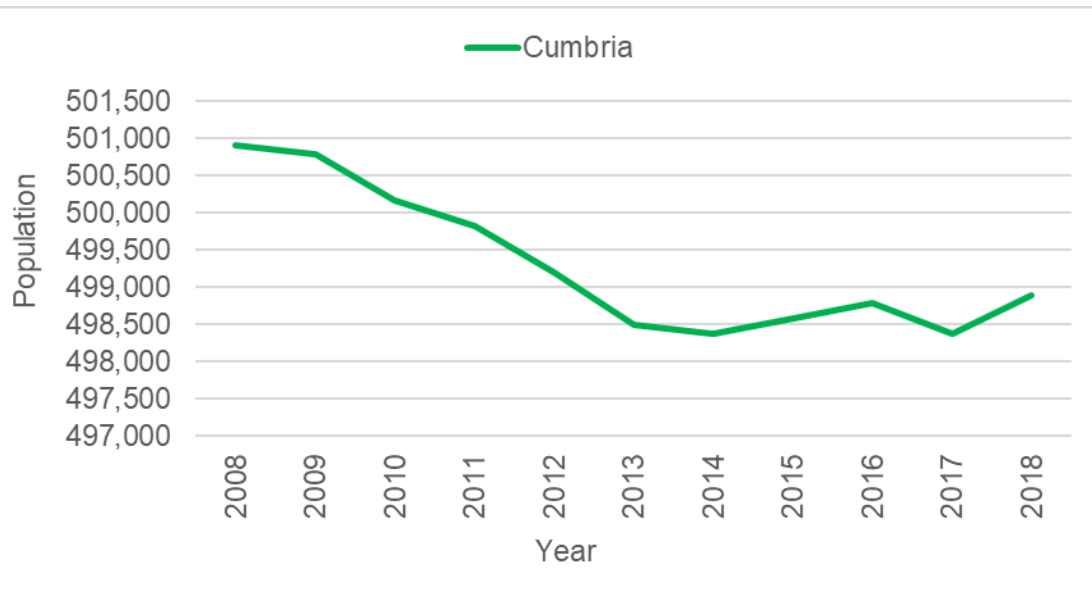
At Mid-2018 Cumbria's population was estimated to be 498,900;

When compared to England & Wales, Cumbria has lower proportions of residents in the three youngest age groups (0-44 years) and higher proportions of residents in the four oldest age groups (aged 45+);

Since Mid-2017, the population of Cumbria has increased by 500 people (+0.1% change), with the greatest percentage increase occurring in the 75 - 84 age group (+2.6%) and the greatest percentage decrease occurring in the 15 - 29 age group (-1.1%);

Since Mid-2017, there have been more deaths than births in Cumbria, this 'natural change' has accounted for a decrease of 1,400 persons across the county. During the same time, 1,900 more people have migrated into Cumbria (from other parts of the UK and overseas) than have migrated out from Cumbria.
