- 4. How many families you have identified for inclusion in the troubled families programme are 'single-parent' households.

Response

1. In Cumbria, the national Troubled Families programme is known as Focus Family. The breakdown of families' ethnicity is in the table below. Please note; this data is at an individual level and not family level.
