Radio, recorded music, live music, streamed music, headphones (optional)

Learning opportunities

- Development of listening and attention and vocabulary
- Promotes active listening
- Supports emotional well-being and the development of emotional intelligence
- · Supports development of individuality and personal choice
- · Promotes abstract and critical thinking

Activity ideas

- Provide opportunities over time for children to listen to a vast range/genre of music. (taking into consideration what is deemed age appropriate)
- Encourage children to respond to music in a manner of ways
 If they liked itstand up, run to one end of the hall/room, put thumbs up etc.
 Choose from two given cards with a happy/sad face on them
 Talk to the person sat next to them, explain to them why they enjoyed it/didn't like it
 Move /dance to the music
- Draw a picture/paint as they listen
- Show the children two or three pictures, ask the children to think about which picture the music matches.
- Possible questions to ask the children.... What shall we call this piece of music? What does this music make you think of? What story does this music tell you?
