

## Cumbria County Council

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Cumbria County Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to Irthington Village School (Community), Irthington, Carlisle, Cumbria. CA6 4NJ from 01 January 2013.

The proposal is to change the age range at Irthington Village School from the current 4-11 year olds to 3-11 year olds.

The proposed alteration will make provision for 0 full time nursery pupils and 8 part time nursery pupils.

The current capacity of the school is 56 and the proposed capacity will be 56. The current admission number for the school is 8 and the proposed admission number will be 8.

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### Explanatory Notes

1. The Local Authority is proposing to make a prescribed alteration to the school by extending the age range to allow the provision of nursery education.
2. The nursery will be accommodated in the existing school buildings and will provide for up to 8 part-time places. The nursery would operate 1 session each day (Monday to Friday) 9am-12pm during term time. Each session will usually last 3 hours. Children from families meeting the criteria will be allowed to access, free of charge, up to 15 hours each week (5 three hour sessions).
3. Admission to the nursery will be in accordance with the school's published policy on nursery admissions.
4. Admission to the nursery does not guarantee a place in the first year infant group i.e. the reception group. The county council's admissions policy, as amended from time to time will apply for admission to the reception group to which up to 8 pupils will be admitted in September 2013. That is also the number of places that it is anticipated will be available in the other year groups.
5. All objections and other comments made (and not withdrawn in writing) within the representation period will be sent in full to Cumbria County Council's Cabinet and published on the website; thereby making them a public document. The final decision on whether or not to implement these proposals will be made using guidance provided by the Department for Education, by the Cabinet of Cumbria County Council, within 2 months of the end of the representation period.
