

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Information Sheet 3 - Governance 21 May 2020



The majority of schools are now closed following guidance from government. Some schools remain open as Hub provision, to offer childcare for vulnerable pupils and children of key workers. Governance in some format must continue for all schools, regardless whether open or closed. The Governor Support Team (GST) have drawn together some information for governors to consider during this period.

Headteacher Reporting

In previous documents, GST have highlighted areas of feedback that governing boards may expect to receive from leaders in their school during the pandemic.

Taking our previous information into consideration, as well as a number of other models that we have seen (including those from The Key), we have developed a [template](#) which headteachers and governors may find useful. This document can be adapted to the needs of individual schools.

Managing school premises during the coronavirus outbreak

Actions for educational and childcare settings to prepare for wider opening from 1st June 2020

It is anticipated, that from the week commencing 1st June 2020 at the earliest, primary schools will be asked to welcome back children in Nursery, Reception, year 1 and year 6, alongside priority groups. Secondary schools, sixth form and further education colleges will be asked to offer some face-to-face support to supplement the remote education of year 10 and year 12 students who are due to take key exams next year, alongside the full time provision they are offering to priority groups.
