### Works update

The Pooley Bridge community should now regularly be seeing members of our team working busily on site since our last public consultation meeting two months ago. We recognise you will not yet see any structural changes, however we have been gathering as much information about the area as we can, whether this be topographical surveys of the local terrain, ascertaining positions of utilities or establishing ground conditions. All of this information is vital to progressing the final design of the new Pooley Bridge

In terms of design, since the last stakeholder meeting we have been completing onerous engineering reviews on concept drawings and during the next period we will have completed the validation of this concept and will start progressing detailed design.
